




















## Panthers entertain Queen Jama with victory during 'Smash It Up' Homecoming festivities


Leading the way were Jama Roth and Rodney Lathrom. All the candidates had smiling faces as the winner was announced.



The ladies were very competitive running a 6-2 defense and having strong offensive skills. Their hitting


consisted of outside, middle, and offside to confuse blockers.


The basketball team got off to a slow start, but finished in a blaze of glory as they played forthe District championship for the first time in 11 years and finished with a 14-12 record.


The JV finished 6-13 for the year including two losses to varsity teams in the Mtn. Grove Tournament.






**Junior Chris Ridens,** far left, prepares to take a pick-off throw during the District tournament against Houston.




















